

## 2026 Paracycling International Pace Standards - Track

The 2026 track pace standards were developed using individual time trial results from the following competitions (unless otherwise noted):

2023: UCI Paracycling Track World Championships (Glasgow, Scotland, UK)

2024: UCI Paracycling Track World Championships (Rio de Janeiro, BRA)  
Paralympic Games (Paris, FRA)

2025: UCI Paracycling Track World Championships (Rio de Janeiro, BRA)

Standards were calculated for each of the 12 paracycling track sport classes (6 men's classes and 6 women's classes) as follows:

- Both Qualifying (when available) and Final round times were used to increase the number of data points
  - Third-place times were used
  - In cases where there was no third-place result, fewer events were used for that sport class, and the time standard was calculated using only those events with a minimum of 3 finishers.
- Individual Pursuit for B Sport Classes:
- MB Classification: Third-place qualifying and final round times were averaged.
  - WB Classification: In order to account for the new 4K distance, final 1K split times were added to the 3K times for 2023 and 2024 events. Then, available third-place qualifying and final round times were averaged.
- 1-Kilometer Time Trial for B and C1-5 Classes:
- MB and MC1-5 Classifications: The available third-place qualifying and final round times were averaged by class.
  - WB Classification: Third-place qualifying and final times were averaged.
  - WC1-5 Classifications: In order to account for the new 1K distance, a split % was calculated for each sport class using Rio 2025 women's 1K data.
    - First, a split % was calculated for each sport class by comparing the last 500m versus the first 500m of the women's kilo time trials at Rio 2025, using the top 3 results from both the qualifying and final rounds. The total last 500m splits were divided by the total first 500m splits to develop the split %. (In cases where there was no qualifying round, only the final round times were used for that sport class.)
    - Second, the split % was applied to third-place 500m results from 2023 and 2024 to estimate 1K finish times for those events.
    - Finally, the third-place qualifying and final 1K times (estimated for 2023 and 2024, and raw data for 2025) were averaged.
